General Information

Total credits: 60 ECTS credit points

Language of instruction: English

Course duration: 1 year full-time, October - September

Lecture schedule: Monday to Friday from 9:00 to 18:00, incl. a mandatory Retreat Week in the second week of October and occasional evening/weekend events

Tuition fees: EUR 6,000 per semester + approx. EUR 85 LMU administration fee

Application and Admission

Admission Requirements

- Completed, first university degree of min. 240 ECTS credit points in a health-related science
- At least two years of work experience in the health sector proven by references from (former) employers covering the candidate's work experience of at least two years
- English Language Proficiency: Level C1 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) evidenced by TOEFL 95-120; IELTS 6.5-7.5; native speaker or entire academic education in English

- Participants will be selected on a first-come, first-serve basis

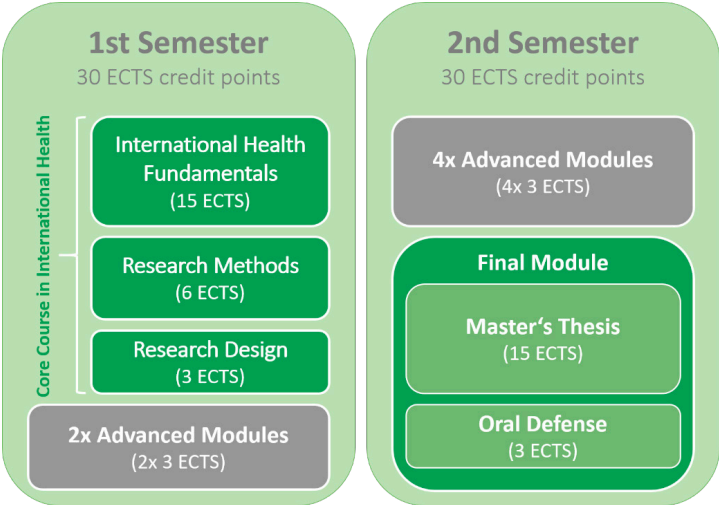

Master of Science in International Health

The post-graduate Master's program in International Health (M.Sc. IH) focuses on health-related challenges in low and middle-income settings. The interdisciplinary approach aims to provide students with knowledge in international and global health, covering global public health, infectious and non-communicable diseases, chronic diseases, health economics and politics. Furthermore, students will be trained in research methods and skills in order to conduct research for their MSc thesis.
