

Medical certificate for employment at the LMU Klinikum

Dear Sir or Madam,

a necessary prerequisite for employment at the LMU Klinikum is proof of immunity to various infectious diseases. The LMU Klinikum is also responsible for patient protection. As a maximum care hospital, we treat a high proportion of patients at risk of nosocomial infections (immunocompromised, multimorbid). Therefore, according to the measles protection law, immunity regarding measles, according to § 23a infection protection law, immunity regarding whooping cough and chicken pox and according to the law for strengthening vaccination prevention against COVID-19, immunity regarding coronavirus is required for all assigned persons. This also applies to persons with primarily non-patient duties (e.g., administration), as they may have (in)direct patient contact by entering wards.

The complete completion of the attached certificate by a licensed physician is a necessary prerequisite for your assignment at the hospital; this is the only way to ensure the protection of patients and employees from infectious diseases.

In principle, the publicly recommended vaccinations should be updated regularly. In this regard, consultation with a company physician or family physician is advisable.

Please visit your doctor at least 6 weeks before the planned start of your work with the attached certificate form, so that any necessary vaccinations can be carried out in good time.

We would like to point out that incomplete information or a lack of immune protection can lead to the fact that the activity at the LMU Klinikum cannot be started.

The physician must have completed the form in full and signed it. Afterwards, please send it to the site of the company medical service in whose area you will be working at least 2 weeks before the planned start of your work:

Regardless of the evidence required, additional vaccinations may be useful for personal protection due to the risks of infection posed by professional activities, e.g., hepatitis A and polio vaccination when in contact with patient excretions and hepatitis B vaccination when handling human tissue, blood or blood components.

Immunities concerning Measles, Chicken pox and Whooping cough, Covid19 are compulsory for every trainee. Exception "career day without active participation":

Measles

- trainee obtained at least two vaccinations *or*
 positive serologic testing for measles immunity

Chicken pox

- confirmed chicken pox disease in trainee's medical history *or*
 trainee obtained at least two vaccinations *or*
 positive serologic testing for chicken pox immunity

Whooping cough

- trainee obtained a vaccination _____ (date) (within the last 10 years) *or*
 documented disease by laboratory testing on _____ (date) (within last 10 years)

Hepatitis B and C: If nursing/medical/dental/assistance tasks will be performed on patients, confirm additionally:

- infectious hepatitis B is currently ruled out (basic hepatitis B immunization + antiHBs >100 or HBs-AG neg. within last 3 months)
 infectious hepatitis C is currently ruled out (antiHCV neg. within last 3 months)

HIV: If invasive/surgical tasks will be performed on patients, confirm additionally:

- HIV infection is currently ruled out (results originating within last 3 months)

Hepatitis A: If preparation of food/cooking tasks in canteens or shared kitchens will be performed, confirm additionally:

- trainee obtained at least two vaccinations *or*
 positive serologic testing of immunisation
